What's involved?	<ul> <li>To assist in seasonal gardening tasks throughout the year that will develop as the gardens develop</li> </ul>
	Volunteers work in supervised groups usually led by a member of the gardens team staff
	Some tasks are physically demanding and require a level of manual dexterity
	Garden maintenance – including weeding, mulching, edging, raking,
	digging over, pruning, dead heading, bed preparation, tidying and path maintenance
	Seed sowing and potting up
	Composting – processing, spreading and digging in
	Bed renovation and grounds development - reinstating and installing
	beds, ground preparation, planting, bulb planting
	<ul> <li>Clearing overgrown areas – keeping on top of the ivy and other invasive species</li> </ul>
	Woodland management – coppicing and grubbing out
	Meadow management – ground preparing, cutting down and raking
	While support and training will be provided, from time to time
	volunteers may work independently or without one to one supervision

At the end of this an appropriate person will catch up with you. This is an opportunity for both parties to reflect and make any adjustments to the role that are needed</li> <li>Access to our volunteer's website, the "Volunteer Portal", including a blog, downloadable resources, rota and events page</li> <li>The nearest tube station is Putney Bridge</li> <li>The nearest railway station is Putney</li> </ul>
